



Dear praying friends,

We can honestly say, “We felt those prayers immensely in the month of March.”

Two weeks ago, we found out the great joy that we were expecting our third child! The immediate emotions and feelings were overwhelming. After Abbey suffered a miscarriage last June, we wondered if it would even be possible to have another child. While we treaded carefully in getting our hopes up, we also could not help but praise the Lord for what we were considering a miracle in the making. Was God going to answer our prayers about having another child? Was Carson finally getting a brother or sister?

Then came Saturday morning. Abbey woke up with very painful cramping---the same cramping that she experienced last June. We rushed to the hospital where they began running scans and various tests. After these scans and tests, everything looked to be normal. After three hours at the women’s wing in the hospital, we went to get a second opinion at another hospital. They concurred with the first hospital, but discovered that Abbey’s HCG levels were abnormally low. The doctor recommended HCG injections once a week to assist in the development of the baby and for Abbey to go on immediate bed rest. We went home with hope.

On Sunday morning, we were met with the painful realization that Abbey had suffered her second miscarriage early in the morning. Just like last June, the questions began to swirl. I will not pretend to have had the joy of the Lord over the past several days. This has been a struggle and I know it will be a struggle for the next little while. Will God allow us to have another child? Did we do something wrong? Did we rush back into pregnancy? Why did God allow us to get pregnant again only to miscarry another baby? We are not the first people to go through this and I know we will not be the last. We will continue to look to God just like we look to Him when things are going well. In addition, we are grateful for the supporting cast of laborers that we have here in Uganda. The Pridgen family has been a tremendous blessing in helping us with Carson. God has provided great friends in the ministry to help us bear this burden. **2 Corinthians 12:9**, *“And he said unto me, My grace is sufficient for thee: for my strength is made perfect in weakness...”*
